Challenging times put focus on professional crop packaging

FARMING faces huge uncertainty as the new Agriculture Bill and post-Brexit market changes loom closer. But livestock will still need feeding with properly preserved silage and hay, bedding with well-kept straw, and energy schemes will continue to demand ever heavier bales of straw.

Crucially, farmers and contractors will need to do all those things more efficiently and more cost-effectively than ever. Enter the professionals. Distributors across the UK are recognising the value of working with a truly professional supplier of netwrap, twine and stretch-wrap, as they strive to give customers more than their competitors.

Product quality key

"There's a lot of products on the market, but in our experience Tama's quality is second to none," says Stuart Davies of distributor Agrii. "They stand by their quality too. If a customer has an issue they're straight on the phone to get it sorted. And, like Agrii, they're innovative. We like to align ourselves with innovative companies. So, whilst we could stock five or six brands, we just stock Tama. It's a relationship that really works."

Offering more

The ability to give customers more than competitors follows decades of development. Other suppliers offer indifferent products, based on limited research and testing, little appreciation of the needs of farmers and contractors, and frequently poor service and technical support.

By contrast Tama works hand-in-glove with machinery manufacturers, is constantly evaluating products onfarm and learning from its own farming experiences. The result is netwrap, twine and stretch-wrap that works so well with today's balers and wrappers, and is supported by unparalleled service and on-farm back-up.

"I don't think there's anything better out there," says Terry Pearce of JW & TJ Pearce at Lulsgate, Bristol. "The last thing you want with netwrap is customers switching, getting problems and then returning product. It happens with other brands, but not Tama." Service scores highly too. "If an issue develops, they're quick to get it sorted. And the price is always competitive," he says.

Machinery maker collaboration

Tama's product line-up is specifically tailored to meet the needs of every crop packaging application. Its products are approved and recommended by the top machinery manufacturers, including Case IH, Claas, John Deere, AGCO, New Holland and Kuhn.

Collaboration from early design to infield testing ensures machines work in complete harmony with the netwrap, twine and stretch-wraps Tama develops. Other manufacturers get nowhere near such a partnership.

"Tama certainly have a reputation for working with the baler makers," agrees Gary Donald, Parts Manager at Pallisers in Yarkhill, Hereford. "Balers generally seem better set-up for Tama products, which makes sense when they've been designed and tested with them. We've not had any issues, and that appeals to contractors who are looking to boost work rates and avoid downtime."

Richard Cook at G & J Peck in Spalding, Lincolnshire agrees. "Having the seal of approval from New Holland and Case means a lot. It isn't always easy getting a farmer or contractor to switch from what they're used to, but once they do, and we get the machine set up for the product, they start to see the benefits, be it more bales per pallet, or less downtime.

"Users like Tama's approach to innovation too – they're looking for that in a supplier, as hauliers and power stations demand ever heavier bales."

Excellent service

Great service includes on-time deliveries and unrivalled customer support. "Years ago netwrap used to run into shortages, but not today," Mr Donald notes. "Tama's service is one of the quickest in the industry and it's the same for technical support – it's industry leading."

Product testing

It all stems from a keen awareness of

the gritty realities of modern farming. Tama tests all its products (and those of competitors) in all the major brands of balers in challenging conditions all around the world, including on its own 6300ha of farmland in Israel.

That hands-on awareness helps pinpoint the practical needs of farmers and contractors. Longer but lighter rolls, carry handles, end-of-roll markers and edge-to-edge coverage are just some of the resulting features.

"It's like a proven part, you can sell it and be confident there won't be issues," says Paul Juggins of Lister Wilder at Thornbury, Bristol. "Farmers and contractors know it is a premium product and when they come on board

they never go back. It does what it says it will, which other products maybe don't." He believes the close working relationship with baler makers helps a lot. "If a new baler comes out you know it has been fully evaluated with Tama product."

For know what you are getting. The product those of us old enough to remember, range brings twines of performance this number originally meant 7,200 feet in the 2-spool pack. Sadly, time from the lower 'standard' density (LSB Long), the regular 'high'-density (LSB has eroded this to the sorry situation that all of the twines sold in the UK Power) to the extreme 'high'-density (HD Extra)for the modern HDP and XD nowadays are well below this length. One distributor openly advertises their balers, all clearly defined by the colour product having a minus 10% tolerance scale on the packaging. on pack length, whilst another, selling

Twine at the lower end of Tama's twine range, in the green colour segment, equates exactly to the traditional and 'honest' 7,200ft twine, but in a much longer pack length (9,600ft) to extend baler output. When Tama introduced this twine, it was given the name 'Big Spool Type 72' – in an effort to identify it as being a twine in the strength and performance range of what 'traditional

7,200ft twine should be.

Unfortunately, the corruption of what was '7200' by the many producers cheating with shorter, thicker twine, created huge confusion in the market. To address this, and remove any confusion in Tama's range, the twine at the lower end of the range has been re-named as LSB LONG, to better identify its place relative to the higher performance LSB POWER, which equates to the performance of the 'cheating' and heavier twines still called '7200'.

The bottom line... spend a moment understanding what you are buying. The number on a pack of twine often has no meaning and can make you think you are buying something that you are familiar with, but is not really so. Be careful out there!
